After taking a break from the music business, producer Dennis Johnson returns with the 'Soca Jam EP', an island-flavored project aimed at getting party animals on the dance-floor.

The title track, done by Grub Cooper, was released on July 4 by Finatic Records, Johnson's company. 'Roll Your Waist' by Honorebel, 'Caribbean Ting' by Mr. Easy and a remix of 'Roll Your Waist' with Honorebel and Ackah Dan are also on the 'Soca Jam EP'. Cooper said once he heard the draft of 'Soca Jam', there was no hesitation about getting on board. Initially, Cooper's track was to be the only song for 'Soca Jam', but Johnson eventually approached Honorebel and Mr. Easy to voice on the uptempo beat.

Miami Carnival turns 41 in 2025 and organizers are planning to celebrate the milestone in a big way. The annual event officially starts October 4th with its Junior Carnival and ends October 12th with the epic live show and Road March. Typically, the finale will be a true Caribbean affair with artists expected from The Bahamas, Dominica, Grenada, St. Lucia and Trinidad and Tobago. Bunji Garlin and his wife Fay-Ann Lyons, soca royalty from Trinidad and Tobago, are headliners.


John T. Beckford, who has been part of Miami Carnival since inception, is its chief marketing officer and a board member for over 20 years. He promises another stellar spectacle.

“In store for Miami Carnival this year are over 18 Mas bands on the road for Carnival Sunday on October 12; and over nine Junior bands on Saturday, October 4. The format for Pan is a Pan Jamboree instead of Pan Competition on Friday, October 10th. And, J’ouvert promises to be the best ever. Then on Saturday, October 11, from 7 am to 3 pm, it’s all about paint, powder, mud, water and plenty vibes!” Beckford disclosed.

Like Caribana in Toronto, Canada and West Indian Day Parade in Brooklyn, New York, Miami Carnival is a massive showcase of Caribbean culture and unity in the United States. It not only attracts a diverse audience, but provides a financial boon for the Magic City. Its ability to draw fans of soca music from beyond Florida has made the week-long festival a commercial juggernaut.

“The economic impact cannot be overlooked, with 31 percent of the patrons and revelers hailing from outside Florida, generating over \$144M in spending. That means tourism and that begets jobs, jobs, jobs!” Beckford exclaimed.

Blaka Dan from Grenada, Trinidadian-American Anika Berry, Imran Nerdy and Arthur Allain from St. Lucia and Julien Believe from The Bahamas are some of the artists scheduled to perform at Miami Carnival 2025.



IAN "DENNIS" JOHNSON

While he is a reggae man at heart, Ian "Dennis" Johnson is an open book when it comes to music. Last July, he showed a different side to his production skills by releasing 'Soca Jam EP', a four-song project featuring Jamaican acts like Mr. Easy and Honorebel. Released by Johnson's Finatic Records, 'Soca Jam EP' is the start of bigger things to come. His plans include promoting soca shows in Jamaica, New York City and Canada in 2026.

"I have always wanted to produce soca music, but the time is right now, as I am planning to promote some soca events next year and decided to record the 'Soca Jam EP' as the initial part of the program," he said. The songs on 'Soca Jam EP' are 'Caribbean Ting' by Mr. Easy, 'Roll Your Waist' by Honorebel, the title track from Grub Cooper of Fab Five fame, and a remix of 'Roll Your Waist' by Honorebel and Ackah Dan from Antigua. Johnson, a Jamaican, has been part of the South Florida reggae scene for decades. He has produced songs by big names such as Bob Andy, Dennis Brown and Cutty Ranks as well as Miami-based artist Trini.

With 'Soca Jam EP', he welcomed the opportunity for a change of pace. "There is not much difference in producing soca, dancehall, or reggae. Although the genres are different, what is most important is the artists and musicians you are working with," Johnson noted.

Although known for collaborating with reggae and dancehall artists, Johnson has strong ties to soca. Since 2010, he has promoted Soca Jam shows at high-profile venues in South Florida such as Seminole Hard Rock Casino and Tropics In The Pines Restaurant and Lounge.

ORIGIN STORY

A derivative of calypso, soca emerged in Trinidad and Tobago during the early 1980s, around the same time dancehall music exploded in Kingston, Jamaica. Over the years, artists from both genres have collaborated with great results.

The most successful exponents of soca out of Jamaica are undoubtedly the Fabulous Five Band. In the 1970s, they were known for easy-listening reggae songs like 'Come Back And Stay' and 'Asking For Love', but a decade later, recast themselves as a soca unit with a flurry of hit singles including 'Yuh Safe', 'All Night Party', 'Feeling Horny', and 'Jamaican Woman'.


Grub Cooper, who played drums, arranged and sang on those hit singles, was recruited in early 2025 by Ian "Dennis" Johnson to help create 'Soca Jam EP', a four-song soca project featuring dancehall acts.

In 1993, deejay Admiral Bailey was one of the hottest acts in Jamaica. He was recruited by Byron Lee and The Dragonaires to work on 'Dancehall Soca' which became the official theme song that year for Jamaica Carnival.

That set the tone for similar collaborations. Machel Montano, recognized by many fans as the King of Soca, has done several songs with Shaggy including 'Toro Toro' in 1998. Five years later, Barbadian star Rupee called on Lady Saw to join him on a remix of his hit, 'Tempted 2 Touch'.

Recently, Grenadian soca artist Ms Fluffy hooked up with Jamaican dancehall veteran Macka Diamond on 'Leave Me Alone', a good-time track saluting the Caribbean woman's carefree attitude during Carnival season.

"For me, it's not just about working with top dancehall artistes, it's about collaborating with people who understand the culture and bring that real energy to a project."
